They represent each artist in his specialty, and the collection has been pronounced, by competent *connoisseurs* of New York, to be one of the most representative, as well as the choicest, ever sent from that city.

The *chef-d'œuvre* of one of our first artists (his Academy Picture of last year) has been kindly loaned for this Exhibition, in recognition of the generous support given by the people of this section to the Exhibition of 1878.

Mr. Smith will also say that in no sense is this a commercial speculation—the pictures being the property of the artists, who receive the entire proceeds, less 10 per cent. commission, which will be paid to Mr. Gill to defray the necessary expenses. And having interested himself this year, contrary to his intention and at much personal inconvenience, he feels that it is not too much

to ask that the people of Western Massachusetts will give this effort a generous patronage, and see to it that the sales do not fall below those of last year. And he also hopes that the public spirit shown by Mr. Gill, in opening in Springfield two galleries, equal to the finest in New York, and superior to any in Boston, will be rewarded by a patronage which will enable him to maintain them.
