On the opening of the Third Annual Exhibition of the Artists of New York, under the sole management of Mr. Gill, Mr. Smith would call the attention of the people of Springfield to the fact that only two years ago they were unknown in the Art world as patrons of the Fine Arts, and in that brief space of time they have taken the front rank among those of the smaller cities, and now divide the honors with those of Utica, who, for many years, took the lead. "Sheep Shearing." Bavarian Highlands.

This picture was painted and exhibited in Munich during 1876; was highly spoken of by the art critics, and received the hearty recommendations of the artists.

On Mr. Shirlaw's return to America, it was exhibited in New York at the Academy of Design, and was received with great favor. It was requested for the last Paris Exposition, and there placed in the American Art Department, and received its "Honorable Mention." The interior is a Stall in connection with a Monastery close at hand, but in which the Monks have long ceased to dwell or claim ownership thereto. The subject was taken for the picturesque opportunity of grouping the figures, and the effects of light and shade.

The Shearers are women from the country sections around about, who form themselves into a band and make their engagements in advance, and earn good wages. A merrier and more fun-loving company it would be hard to find. They commence work about 4 o'clock in the morning, and clip, clip, clip, until sundown. Mr. Shirlaw has refused larger places this work, and Springfield is favored by it.
