Supplies Cont.:

- Paints (look for student grade paints such as Windsor-Newton "Winton" paints
 - 2 reds -pick from cadmium red med. or cadmium red light in alizarin, crimson or rose
 - 2 or 3 yellows cadmium yellow light, cadmium yellow medium, yellow ochre
 - 2 blues ultramarine blue, prussian blue, phthalocyanine blue and cobalt blue or cerulean blue
 - burnt umber or raw umber
 - raw sienna
 - titanium white
 - Brushes (5 or 6 in a variety of sizes, check brush handles for size info):
 - size 1-4 rounds
 - size 4-8 Philbert
 - size 3-6 angle

PAINTING SUPPLIES

- Brushes: Get 5 or 6 brushes choosing from a variety of sizes:
 - Size 1-4 (rounds)
 - o Size 4-8 (Philbert)
 - o Size 3-6 (Angle)
 - o Size 6-12 Flat or Bright
 - Look on the brush handles for size information.
- Painter's tape (hardware store)
- 8"x10" canvas boards- at least 3
- One of either a 11"x 14"or 16"x 20" stretched canvas
- Paint Medium such as Liquin
- Painting Pallet or Pallet Paper pad. (Pallet Paper pad is easier clean-up, not as stable as pallet).
- Turpenoid for brush clean-up and other tasks
- glass jar (baby food jars work great)
- Paper Towels/Rags for blotting and cleaning

PAINTING SUPPLIES

- pink eraser
- sketch paper
- canvas paper (suggested size range: from 11x14 14x18)
- *oil or acrylic paints:
 - o cadmium red or primary red
 - cadmium yellow or primary yellow
 - ultramarine blue
 - o alizarin crimson
 - o pthalo blue or pthalo blue-green
 - yellow ochre or naples yellow
 - venetian red or red oxide
 - burnt umber
 - Paynes gray
 - white (large tube)
- medium (i.e. galkyd for oils or your preferred; for acrylic: gloss and/or matte)
- baby oil if using oil paint
- rags
- palette, at least 16" x 20" you can make one with a cookie sheet (or similar size board)
 - masking tape
 - freezer paper wrap the paper around the cookie sheet so you have the full surface to use, tape the back.
- 2 palettes cups for medium
- brushes (your preferred or #4, #6, #8 filberts and # 6 round)
- tracing paper (9 x 12 or 11 x 14)
- If using acrylic paint: bring spray bottle for water.
 - *If you have a strong preference for another paint medium, you are welcome to bring that instead
