The Frick Collection New York City

7:15 am – Please park and meet the bus at the State Street parking lot located across from the Springfield Main Library, 220 State Street.

7:30 am sharp – **Depart for the Frick Collection.** En route to New York City, we'll pause for a brief rest stop and enjoy a boxed lunch before arriving at the newly renovated Frick Mansion on 70th Street around **11:00 AM.**

Upon arrival, immerse yourself in a self-guided tour of the former residence of renowned industrialist Henry Clay Frick (1849–1919), who generously bequeathed both his Gilded Age home and remarkable art collection for public appreciation. Open to visitors since 1935, the Frick Collection offers an unusually intimate viewing experience with one of the world's most prestigious assortments of European fine and decorative arts, featuring masterworks spanning the Renaissance to the early 20th century such as Vermeer, El Greco, Rembrandt, Turner, Monet to name a few.

Originally completed in 1914 by the architectural firm Carrère and Hastings, the mansion was designed with the specific intent to showcase Frick's collection. Thoughtfully restored in recent years, the building retains its historic elegance while benefiting from modern enhancements that improve accessibility and ensure its preservation for future generations.

Experience this iconic museum in its refreshed form—gracefully updated yet still faithful to its timeless charm.

3:00 pm – Departure with an estimated return by 6:30 pm. What to bring: Water and snacks for the bus; bottled water is provided on the return; dress in layers as temperatures vary; bring sun protection.

Cost: \$149, Members, \$175, nonmembers; includes admission, boxed lunch, bus travel and driver tip; Maximum: 38 participants.
